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Board Approves Capital Credit Retirement

At their regular October meeting, the Cooperative Board of Directors approved the retirement of \$3 million in capital credits. Individual Cooperative member checks are scheduled to be mailed during the first full week in December. This marks the 32nd consecutive year that the Cooperative has retired capital furnished by its members. The amount retired from a member's allocated total is paid to the member in the form of a check.

Capital credit retirement checks are mailed to the last known address supplied to the Cooperative. It is important to notify Plateau of any address changes so future retirements can be forwarded. It is also recommended that members keep capital credit information with their important papers so family members will know of future retirements.

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Mark Your Calendar

November 18 Board of Directors Meeting – Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, the Cooperative’s Board of Directors meet one week earlier at the Cooperative’s business offices north of Clovis or by video conference.

November 19 Anniversary of the Gettysburg Address – On November 19, 1863, at the dedication of a military cemetery at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, during the American Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln delivers one of the most memorable speeches in American history. In fewer than 275 words, Lincoln brilliantly and movingly reminded a war-weary public why the Union had to fight, and win, the Civil War.

November 25 Thanksgiving – The American Thanksgiving holiday tradition is commonly traced back to the 1621 celebration at Plymouth, Massachusetts.

November 28 Advent Begins – Advent is a holy season in the Christian calendar signaling the beginning of the liturgical calendar. In the early days of the church, Advent was a time of prayer and confession. Today, it is more a time of preparation and anticipation of Christmas. It takes place on the four Sundays before Christmas.

November 28 Hanukkah Begins – Also known as the “Festival of Lights,” Hanukkah is an eight-day Jewish holiday celebrating the rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem in the Second Century B.C. Hanukkah is the Hebrew word for “dedication.”

December 7 National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day – President Franklin D. Roosevelt declared this day as “...a day that will live in infamy” in a speech to Congress on December 8, 1941, a day after forces of the Imperial Japanese Air Service attacked the U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor in the Hawaiian Islands. The attack crippled the U.S. Pacific Fleet and caused the country to enter World War II.

December 21 Winter Solstice – Old Man Winter is officially here. The winter solstice occurs when the Earth’s northern hemisphere is tilted at its farthest point away from the Sun, causing it to be the shortest day and longest night of the year. The winter solstice is traditionally considered the first day of winter.
